TEACHING

The New School Graduate Acting Program (NYC) – Taught acting based in the late-Stanislavsky improvisatory technique of Analysis Through Action.

American Shakespeare Center (Staunton, VA) – Adapted and directed *Romeo & Juliet* for an ensemble of young actors and led physical theater workshops. Live Arts (Charlottesville, VA) – Adapted and directed *Twelfth Night* for young actors and led classes in Shakespeare's text and physical theater.

• I have also been invited to discuss theater and theater criticism in classes and panels at Yale, Columbia, New York University, Cornell, Loyola University, and Emory University, as well as at the Shakespeare Theatre Company in Washington, D.C., Theatre Cedar Rapids, Epic Theatre Company, and conferences with the American Theatre Critics Association and the National Alliance for Musical Theatre.
